

Dorchester School District Two Procedure for Over –The- Counter (OTC) Medication

Your child may have over-the-counter medication at school (aspirin, Tylenol, cough syrup, etc.) per Joint Advisory Opinion Issued by South Carolina Boards of Medical Examiners, Nursing and Pharmacy, Regarding OTC Medicine and Schools by following ALL of the instructions below:

- Deliver the completed Dorchester School District Two medication permission form completed including the signature of the doctor or other legal prescriber.
- An unopen container of the OTC medication and properly labeled by the pharmacist. Your physician or legal prescriber will have to write a prescription for the OTC medication so you can present it to the pharmacist. (See picture of a properly labeled OTC medication below)
- Medication **MUST** be brought in by parent/legal guardian, **NOT** the student.
